"We have all heard the old saying 'where there is a will, there is a way.' I have the will if you will show me the way," he said.

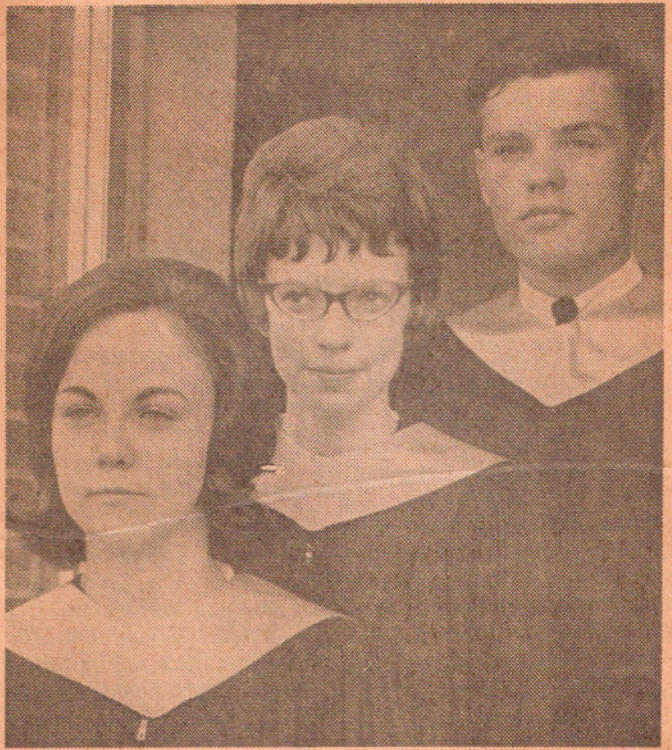

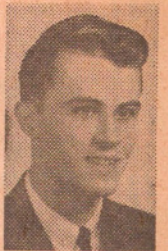
