

(D) MSP As amended:

"WHEREAS, the Gay Students Council was saddened to hear of the destruction of the Metropolitan Church's headquarters and sanctuary in Los Angeles, and WHEREAS, the Gay Students Council recognizes the unique contributions which the Metropolitan Community Church had made to the quality of life of the gay community both locally and nationally, now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Gay Students Council offer its condolences and reaffirm its solidarity with the Metropolitan Community Church, as an agent of faith and social change.

In conjunction with these resolutions, it was MSP (Robbins) that each individual GSU write the ACLU-Southern California in support of Resolution C.

The Chair then read a letter from Ramona Ripston, Director of the ACLU-Southern California, to Jay Murley, Chairman of the ACLU-Orange County Chapter, in which Ms. Ripston expressed her regret that the ACLU-SC Board of Directors voted down the inclusion of the phrase "and sexual orientation" in their model fair housing/employment code. Larry Bernard urged individuals and member groups to respond to this letter.

Terry O'Brien also urged the groups to locate and contact their community ACLU chapters and initiate interest and action in the area of gay civil rights.

4. It was MSP (Gleson, Koehler) to receive reports on the status and activities of the member groups:
 - a. CSUF: No report.
 - b. CSULB: announces the "First Annual Helen Twelvetrees Memorial Trash Dance" on Saturday, March 17 at 8 p.m., Room "A", Main Level, Student Union.
 - c. CSULA: No report.
 - d. Claremont Colleges: reports that the group has received grudging official recognition as of this past January, but is having troubles in maintaining an on-going interest.
 - e. El Camino College: will participate in the annual campus Fiesta Week, March 28, 29, 30 to raise funds for the G.A.Y. Will also host the GSC Spring Convocation, April 7, in conjunction with their Gay Pride Week, April 7-14.
 - f. Gay Law Students: have prepared a major brief to be used in the Black Pipe 10 case, documenting the discriminatory nature of statute 647 (a), "Lewd and dissolute conduct." They are also preparing a pamphlet on the process of Law School admission policies and how they affect gay undergraduates contemplating a career in Law. A suggestion was also offered for raising funds: the installation of pin-ball machines, which return an even and steady percentage profit to the sponsoring group.
 - g. UCI: is running alternating sessions of speakers and rap groups this quarter. The speakers' forums are well attended, but the rap session attendance is dwindling rapidly. They have also formed a joint Speaker's Bureau with the GSU at CSUF and the Radical Lesbian Feminists of Orange County.
 - h. UCSB: is currently engaged in a radio program on KCSB. Will have a spot every week next quarter. The newspaper is also planning an extensive article on the Santa Barbara gay community. A speakers bureau has been formed and Consciousness-Raising groups are now organizing. A counsellor from the Gay Community Services Center is coming to campus to train peer-group counsellors.
 - i. USC: reports its condition as "in a state of flux," mainly because of the on-going court battle.
 - j. CSUN: in planning a camping trip and showing a movie for raising funds. They are participating on a KROQ panel, and scheduling weekly rap sessions.
