Whoopi Goldberg Wins Rights Award

The ACLU Lesbian and Gay Rights Chapter has awarded its 1990 Human Rights Award to Whoopi Goldberg. Goldberg's continual support of the gay and lesbian community, as well as her active involvement in producing educational public service announcements on AIDS, her appearance at the 1987 March on Washington, and her yearly involvement in Comic Relief (to benefit homelessness, which affects a significant number of gay and lesbian youths) are some of the highlights of her civil rights and community involvement. The award will be presented at the Lesbian and Gay Rights Chapter's annual ceremony, this year to be held at the Magic Castle in Hollywood.

Other honorees include Torie Osborne, Executive Director of the Gay and Lesbian Community Services Center, for Community Activist Award; Thomas F. Coleman, for the Steve Kelber Courageous Advocate Award; and Larry Lyons, for the Peter Thomas Judge Chapter Leadership Award.

The September 8th brunch, magic show, and ceremony will take place from 11 am to 4 pm at the Magic Castle, 7001 Franklin Avenue, in Hollywood.
