U.S. Supreme Court Begins Georgia Sodomy Hearings

ATTORNEY THOMAS F.COLEMAN REPORTS

On Sunday afternoon May 4 the the regular ONE Institute Extension Lecture (No. 305 in the Series)Attorney Tom Coleman will give an eyewitness account of the proceedings before the U. S. Supreme Court challenging the Constitutionality of the Georgia "Sodomy Law." This is the first such case to be heard by the Supreme Court. Its outcome could affect the laws of the twenty-six states which still have such laws. California threw out its law several years ago, Illinois being first nearly twenty-five years ago.

Attorney Coleman will also discuss the very important "Task Force on Family Diversity" for which he is Special Consultant, an agency established by Councilman Michael Woo to explore the legal needs of the many kinds of families: male/male, female/female which exist in society today. These and other non-traditional families are discriminated against as to property rights, inheritances, insurance, medical care and many other ways. Do not miss this important Lecture to be held in Arlington Hall on the ONE Institute Campus at 3 P. M. May 4. ONLY ACCESS TO THE CAMPUS WILL BE BY THE GATEWAY AT 1TH STREET & VAN NESS.
