COURSE DESCRIPTION

<u>Rights of Domestic Partners</u> LAW 599H (3 Units) Prof. Coleman

This course explores legal, social, economic, and public policy issues associated with the emerging area of "couples rights" (gay and nongay unmarried couples). Not only will students obtain a comprehensive overview of legal controversies involved in substantive "domestic partnership" law (e.g., right to live together; right of survivor to sue for wrongful death; <u>Hardwick \underline{v} . <u>Bowers</u> constitutional right to engage in private sexual conduct; etc.), but students also will learn to develop practical strategies designed to extend family benefits to nonmarital relationships (e.g., revised employee benefit plans, such as sick leave, bereavement leave, and health care coverage; consumer "spousal" discounts extended to couples by insurance companies and membership clubs, etc).</u>

This course is unique, inasmuch as it is a practicum (supervised practial application of legal theory) affiliated with the Los Angeles City Task Force on Family Diversity. Each student will develop a "real world" strategy to implement one or more recommendation(s) from the final report of the Task Force involving domestic partnership rights, and draft a memorandum detailing the strategy plan.

Students will be invited to attend (optional) a special ceremony in May 1988, at which Los Angeles City Councilman Michael Woo will present the final report of the Task Force to several hundred leaders of business, religious, educational, legal, and other communities.
