One of the main features of Unmarried America is its news service and online library, known as **Library One**.

Each day we search the Internet for breaking news and current events affecting the lives of single people everywhere. Several times a week, we post these news stories in one of three news sections of our website: Recent News, Domestic Partner News, and International News. Commentaries, opinion pieces, and feature stories are also reported on our website.

The archives of Library One now contain more than 6,700 pages of information – from hard news, to practical advice, to scholarly papers – in the following areas:

Demographic trends
Legal rights
Political issues
Workplace practices
Financial advice
Health concerns
Tax reform
Lifestyle enhancement
Book reviews

People who make a donation of \$25 to Unmarried America get an annual pass to Library One with a password which gives them access to all pages of the website.

As an added benefit, a pass also enables library patrons to search the site for key words or phrases.

Radio One is the Voice of Unmarried America – a weekly talk show providing an educational and entertaining forum focusing on the lives and the interests of unmarried and single Americans.

You will find the show interesting and informative whether you are unattached or partnered, divorced or widowed, gay or straight.

Radio One has unique program content. We do not dwell endlessly on the search for romance or complaints about failed love relationships. People can find that type of programming elsewhere.



Radio One provides expert advice and stimulating conversations focusing on topics and concerns which affect the other 90 percent of your life – work and home, health and finance, religion and politics, family and friends, travel and recreation.

Radio One is also unique in its accessibility options. Because it is broadcast via the Internet – through World Talk Radio – the show is available to listeners 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. If you can't tune in for a live show, you can listen to it later when the time is more convenient for you schedule.

Radio One has three segments. The show's host, Thomas F. Coleman, talks about the previous week's news stories and Column One commentary in the first part. The second segment features a special guest, often an expert on a topic of interest to single people. The host and the guest engage in a stimulating conversation designed to enlighten and entertain the audience.

In the third part of the show, callers can ask their questions or voice their opinions about whatever happens to be on their minds.

Like public radio, this show is a nonprofit venture and depends on support from listeners like you. Donations to Radio One are tax-deductible.
